

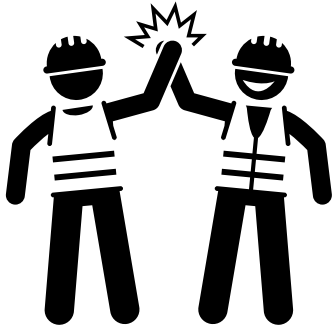

What is an apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is employment-based training that combines structured on-the-job learning with related classroom instruction.

What are the benefits?

An apprentice is paid by their employer and their wage increases over the course of their apprenticeship. They receive mentorship from a journeyman in their trade and a certification upon completion.

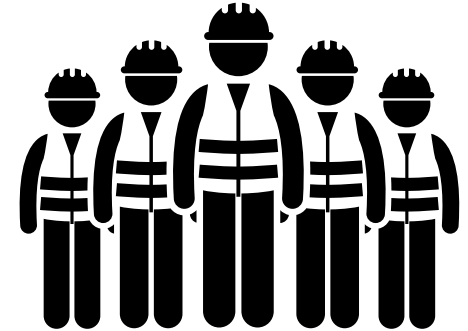

PRESERVATION CARPENTER

Preservation Carpenters reconstruct and rehabilitate wood structures. They do hands-on work with building elements such as framing, doors, floors, staircases, trusses, interior and exterior trim, and roofing.

40% of buildings in the US are over 50 years old - that's nearly 39 million buildings. Rehabilitation is 19% of the construction industry and growing with investments in sustainable building initiatives. Rehabilitation requires 50 - 75% fewer carbon emissions than new construction.



DECONSTRUCTION TECHNICIAN

Deconstruction Technicians unbuild structures, salvaging as much viable building material as possible. They get hands-on taking the buildings apart.
